substituting more than 4.7 print books per year resulted in less greenhouse gas emissions than print.[172] While an e-reader costs more than paper books,[173] E-books may have a lower cost than paper books.[173] E-books can be made available without the price of additional e-books using on-demand book printers.[174] Moreover, numerous e-books are available online free of charge on sites such as Project Gutenberg.[175] For example, all books printed before 1923 are in the public domain in the United States, which enables websites to host ebook versions of such titles for free.[176] Depending on possible digital rights management, e-books (unlike physical books) can be backed up and recovered in the case of loss or damage to the device on which they are stored, a new copy can be downloaded without incurring an additional cost from the distributor.
